A mysterious figure of noble descent embarks on a quest to reclaim lost pieces to the Armor of Mars (relics worn by his ancestors that hold powerful magical properties) and wreak vengeance on those who betrayed his family. Meanwhile his twin sister (also endowed with supernatural abilities) hires renowned street fighter Terry Bogard and his band of world class fighters to stop him.

First theatrical feature (but third in line after two short television productions that aired in Japan) based on a popular video game will not cater to the unknowing or the unconverted, but well-made and compelling with a strong—and genuinely likable—hero at its core. **NOT RATED**

After his wife's suicide an eccentric non-conformist (Mortenson) who lives off the land and home-schools his children travels across country to repossess her remains and honor her final requests. What begins as a fanciful journey of emotional healing spirals into hard-hitting reality as he and his family are forced to contend with a world they rarely partake.

Tender, vicarious examination of a man's coping with grief and predicaments beyond his control is a perfect showcase for Mortenson who is a pillar of strength. Director Ross—a homeschooled child himself—treats his subjects warmly and honestly.
